Welcome to the Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme (ESOS) newsletter, keeping you updated with key information relating to the scheme. In this issue:

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MESOS Reporting System

The Manage your Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme reporting system (MESOS) went live on Tuesday 19th March, with approximately 1,500 accounts successfully created to date.

As detailed in the last two issues of our newsletter, MESOS is being released in two stages, with the initial release allowing all participants to register their Phase 3 user and organisational accounts, and a further release allowing participants to start filling in their notifications of compliance. This second release is planned to go live by Wednesday 24 April 2024. We will also host a webinar the week prior to this, with a date to be confirmed next week, which will be recorded, to support this release.

Compliance Notification Enforcement Extension Position Statement

With the new IT system now live and the requirement of a two-stage compliance notification process, the Environment Agency have taken steps to help participants complete compliance in a timely manner by providing this position statement. This follows extensive discussions with the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero who lead on ESOS policy.

For organisations qualifying for Phase 3 of ESOS, the deadline for submitting a compliance notification is the 5 June 2024 and organisations should still look to meet this compliance notification deadline where possible. However, the Environment Agency and Regulators for the Devolved Administrations will not take enforcement action against you if you do not comply with this legal requirement, provided that you meet both of the following conditions:

- registration of your account in the new IT system has been completed by the 5 June 2024, and
- you submit your notification of compliance by the 6 August 2024

This is in response to stakeholder representations made to UK Government and the Environment Agency on the implementation of ESOS Phase 3, including in relation to the Environment Agency's 'How to Comply' guidance and delays in finalising the new ESOS IT system.

This regulatory enforcement extension period will cease after the 6 August 2024.

We will monitor compliance levels during this extension period and request that participants and lead assessors contact us if they feel they will be unable to submit a notification of compliance by this extension deadline.

MESOS Supporting Guidance

Please find attached guidance that will assist users when carrying out their initial onboarding registration. These cover three scenarios, for which videos are also linked:

For security purposes each time you access the new IT system you will need 2 Factor Authentication (2FA). We have created a [2FA video guide](#) to help you with this requirement.

Users Being Added to Multiple Accounts

There will be instances where users who represent more than one organisation are added to multiple MESOS accounts. As per the ESOS User Management guidance, there are 3 steps that need to be followed here:

Add User	Account Status	Comment
Step 1: New User added	Awaiting Confirmation	Account Status will be in "Awaiting Confirmation"
Step 2: When New User set-up account	ACCEPTED	Account Status changes to "ACCEPTED"
Step 3: Advanced User should manually change the status from ACCEPTED → ACTIVE	ACTIVE	For New User, can log in but cannot see organisation account until their account status is changed to ACTIVE

Please ensure that step 3 is being followed in all cases, as until the status is changed from 'accepted' to 'active' the added user will not be able to access the account.

Guidance Note

The guidance aims to work alongside legislation and help participants in understanding the requirements, but the ultimate source of ESOS requirements is the legislation, namely the [Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme Regulations 2014](#), as amended (including amendments in relation to Phase 3 made by the [Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme \(Amendment\) Regulations 2023](#)), and guidance may not be able to cover every combination of circumstances. The guidance aims to balance comprehensiveness and brevity, with the use of worked examples to provide additional context. In response to feedback from user testing of the new digital system and from the recent webinar, the guidance will be updated. Updated guidance will be provided ahead of the compliance deadline, and participants will be informed through the EA newsletter when the updated guidance is available.
